Co-Creation

What counts as 'knowledge' in your subject and who has a voice? Are you and your experience represented in learning? Colonial history means that certain types and sources of knowledge are seen as more important than others. Decoloniality unpicks and unpacks these histories, to unearth hidden voices and make a diverse and global learning experience.

How can we embed more social, climate, and racial justice into the arts curriculum and arts industries? Social justice attempts to understand inequality and unequal flows of power; enquires about how we can make industries more just and inclusive; brings diversity and representation into the arts; and makes sure it isn't iust about who is in the room and has a voice but what stories they can tell.

Co-Creation is an attempt to create briefs, projects and knowledge, with someone rather than for someone. Co-creation in education implies partnerships and collaboration between staff and students, so that students' diverse experiences and knowledge become part of learning and teaching, and students and staff create the learning experience together.

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
